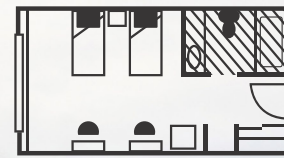
Snowy Range, White Mtn. & Teton Hall Ground Level Suite Unit
Bedroom: 190 sq. ft.



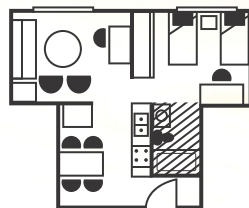
Rocky Mtn. Hall I Suite Unit

Bedroom: 212 sq. ft.



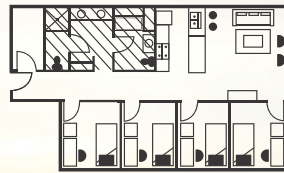
