Program Description

A.S. Exercise Science

This program will provide the foundation to transfer to various four-year programs in exercise science, kinesiology, exercise physiology and related fields. For students who do not plan to continue their schooling or who already have a four-year degree, this two-year program provides an area of concentration in exercise science that enhances marketability in various fitness and wellness occupations and prepares the student to take national fitness certification exams.

Learning Objectives:

To prepare students to transfer to a 4-year institution to continue their education in a related field:

- · Students will learn basic muscle anatomy and function as it relates to movement and how to select appropriate exercises for training individuals.
- · Students will learn the basics of exercise physiology as it applies to exercise testing, fitness and sport applications.
- · Students will learn how to access scientific research, learn how to interpret and read scientific research and have the opportunity to participate as a researcher developing a research question, completing a review of the literature, collecting data, analyzing data and presenting the data.
- · Students have the opportunity to select professionals in the area of interest to shadow and learn from in the community.
- · Students will participate and lead community events where they will provide basic information on fitness, complete fitness testing and host fitness events.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Exercise Science Program at Western is to train our students to apply the academic and practical knowledge learned in their coursework to careers and further educational opportunities. This includes an ability to practically apply a strong background in anatomy, physiology, nutrition, training theory and program personalization to careers in personal training, athletic training, physical therapy and scientific research.
