## Advanced Placement

The Advanced Placement program is sponsored by The College Board and offers secondary school students the opportunity to participate in college-level coursework in high school and to take a national test at the end of their course. See the individual exams for which WWCC awards credit and the required scores listed below.

There is no charge for this credit, and credit is listed on the student's WWCC transcript at the time of matriculation.

## Credit by Examination (Institutional)

Credit by examination is available for any WWCC course when a CLEP exam is not available. The exam is generally the equivalent to the final exam for that course. If the student has a level of proficiency of a minimum "C" grade, the credit is awarded. A grade of 'S' (satisfactory) is listed on the student's transcript.

A student may not earn credit by examination if he/she has completed a course at a higher level than the course being challenged. (The student should look at the course prerequisites when trying to determine if the course is a lower level).

A credit by examination may not be used to remove a failure or to otherwise repeat a course.

A student must be currently enrolled at WWCC in order to take an institutional challenge exam.

No challenge exams are given during the last 30 class days of a semester.

## Procedure

1. Obtain the Credit by Exam form from Mustang Central.
2. Fill out the application. Return form to Mustang Central.
3. Make arrangements with the appropriate instructor to give the exam.
4. Take the exam and make sure the instructor returns the grade to Mustang Central.
5. Student transcripts will be updated when appropriate.
6. Credit and grades from Credit by Exam generally do not transfer.

## Military Credit

Students may receive credit from WWCC for courses earned in the armed forces. Students who wish to receive credit must do the following:

1. Submit the DD214 and the appropriate education documentation to Mustang Central. Whenever possible, the student should submit the DD295, Application for Learning Experience in the Armed Forces with the other documentation.
2. Credit will be awarded according to the Guide to Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services.
3. Credit will be transcribed to the WWCC transcript at the point of matriculation.

Students may also receive two semester hours of physical activity credit for their service in the armed forces. The student should fill out the Military PE Credit Form and submit to Mustang Central. The DD214 must accompany this application if it has not been previously submitted.

- There is no fee for military credit.

## Introduction

Western Wyoming Community College recognizes that each student has a different level of educational preparation and life experience that may contribute to their current educational endeavors at WWCC. Self-study, life or on the job experience, training on the job and in the military, can all provide the student with the skills that are equivalent to those gained in the traditional classroom. With this in mind, WWCC offers a number of methods for achieving college credit without enrolling in coursework.

Students who feel that they have background in a certain subject but have no formal training should consider taking College Level Examinations (CLEP) when available or requesting institutional examinations when CLEP is not available. Those who have military training should submit appropriate documentation for the potential college credit. Those who have formal training on the job or elsewhere and can provide appropriate documentation should consider the Extra-Institutional Credit avenue. Advanced Placement scores are considered for high school seniors who complete Advanced Placement classes and take and pass the national exams.

Credit is transcribed to the student's WWCC transcript at the end of the first semester the student enrolls. No alternative credit is granted to a non-matriculated student. Only forty hours of credit earned through challenge and CLEP may be counted toward graduation from Western Wyoming Community College.
