

COLLEGE ATTORNEY

Reference: W.S. § 21-18-303

As provided by W.S. § 21-18-303, The College Board of Trustees may “employ legal counsel and bear the cost of litigation”. The Board shall appoint a College attorney to advise and represent it.

The College attorney is directly responsible to the Board as a whole. The person appointed shall have a law degree, be in good standing with the local and state bar association and admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of the State of Wyoming. The attorney’s compensation will be determined each year.

Performance Responsibilities

- To advise the Board on the legal implications of College problems and contemplated decisions.
- To give legal counsel and guidance about school bonding and building programs.
- To furnish such legal advice and support as the Board or College administrators may request.
- To represent the Board of Trustees, its members, and the College district in legal actions deriving from college-associated actions.
- To attend meetings agreed upon by the College President/Board President.

Day-to-day supervision of and communication with the College attorney is delegated to the President of the College.
